
A small step forward was all that was needed here to smarten up this forestedge garden. Attractive Purbeck limestone crazy paving was entirely in keeping with local building styles but it felt tired and untidy and a little encroached by the lawn and mature planting. I had an urge to push back the garden a little from the paths and patio areas!



My clients also wanted to iron out some of the steps and to overcome the threadbare grass, competing unsuccessfully with the shallow-rooted large pine trees nearby.



The design challenge was to retain all the features and materials that gave the house a great deal of charm but to modernise it just a little to make it feel crisper and tidier. I also realigned paths slightly and widened them where I felt it necessary. A second 'bump' in the path along the front of the house was created to balance the first 'bump' which was kept. This gave a nice sense of rhythm in the path (you can see this effect in the right hand photograph below).







In the patio area, I made the patio slightly deeper by extending the leading edge to the outside wall of the extension. A brick soldier course gives a neat edge to the relaid limestone crazy paving. As I also levelled out the patio surface a little (and hid the manhole covers), this gave me an opportunity to add a lower step aligned with the kitchen door, echoing the new circular / rounded edges I had created.
